## STEELERS FOLLOWING MONDAY NIGHT FOOTBALL

- Pittsburgh has played 65 games in franchise history on a short week following Monday Night Football. The Steelers own an impressive 36-29 (.554) mark in such contests.
- Pittsburgh has won five of its last seven games on a short week following Monday Night Football.
- The Steelers own a 9-7 (.563) under head coach **Mike Tomlin** on a short week following Monday Night Football.
- Pittsburgh is 27-22 (.551) at home on a short week following Monday Night Football, including a 13-12 (.520) record at Heinz Field.
- The Steelers have hosted the Colts on two occasions on a short week following Monday Night Football, and the series is tied, 1-1.
- Pittsburgh played Baltimore on Oct. 6, following a Monday Night Football contest, and lost in overtime, 29-26.

## STEELERS NAME FOUR TEAM CAPTAINS

- The Steelers selected four players to serve as team captains for the 2019 season, the team announced through a vote of their teammates.
- QB Ben Roethlisberger** and **C Maurkice Pouncey** serve as the offensive captains, **DT Cameron Heyward** serves as the defensive captain and **FB Roosevelt Nix** serves as the special teams captain.
- Roethlisberger was selected as an offensive captain for the 11th time in his career (2008-09, 2011-18). This marks Heyward's fifth consecutive year as a captain (2015-19), and the third time Pouncey has been named a captain (2013, 2018-19).
- Nix was named a captain for the first time in his career.





## SCHEDULE NOTES

- The Steelers are slated to appear in five nationally-televised primetime games, including two Monday Night Football games at Heinz Field, during the NFL's 2019 regular season, it was announced this past spring when the NFL unveiled its 2019 regular season schedule.
- Pittsburgh kicked off its 2019 regular season on Sunday Night Football at the New England Patriots in Week 1 on Sunday, Sept. 8 (NBC, 8:20 p.m.). The Steelers hosted the Seattle Seahawks in Week 2 of the 2019 regular season at Heinz Field for their home opener on Sunday, Sept. 15 (FOX, 1 p.m.).
- The Steelers twice appeared on Monday Night Football at Heinz Field in 2019 (ESPN, 8:15 p.m.), in Weeks 4 (Cincinnati Bengals) and 8 (Miami Dolphins), respectively. Pittsburgh's two other nationally televised primetime games are scheduled for Sunday Night Football at the Los Angeles Chargers in Week 6 on Oct. 13 (NBC, 8:20 p.m.) and a Thursday Night Football game at the Cleveland Browns in Week 11 on Nov. 14 (FOX/NFL Network/Amazon, 8:20 p.m.).
- The Steelers' bye week was on Oct. 20 (Week 7).

## 15 DAYS OFF, 4 GAMES IN 18 DAYS

- Pittsburgh went 15 days between games. The Steelers won at Los Angeles Chargers, 24-17, on Oct. 13, and then defeated Miami Dolphins, 27-14, on Oct. 28 (following their bye week).
- Pittsburgh opened a stretch on Oct. 28 that features four games in the span of 18 days.

## DEFENSIVE RESURGENCE

- Over its first two games of 2019, Pittsburgh allowed 61 points (fifth worst in the NFL), seven TDs (tied for fifth worst), 75.0 opposing completion percentage (fourth worst) and 131.3 opposing passer rating (fourth worst).

- Pittsburgh found itself down 14-0 after the first quarter. The Dolphins gained 91 yards over their first three drives of the game (96 yards in the first quarter). The Steelers limited Miami to 93 yards over their next seven drives (60 yards combined in the second and third quarters).
- Pittsburgh held the Dolphins scoreless over the final 46:41 of the game.
- Miami's longest drive of the game was a 68-yard TD drive in the first quarter. The Dolphins only managed one drive of 40 yards or longer the rest of the game.
- Pittsburgh held Miami to 10 yards or less on six separate drives.
- Pittsburgh limited Los Angeles Chargers to just 32 yards rushing on 14 carries, good for a 2.3 yards/rush average. The Chargers' longest run of the night was 11 yards.

## 2019 STEELERS HALL OF HONOR

The Pittsburgh Steelers announced their **2019 Hall of Honor** class on July 27 at an event at the Fred Rogers Center on the campus of Saint Vincent College.

The 2019 class includes the following (in alphabetical order):

### Larry Brown: Tight End/Tackle (1971-84)

- Spent 14 seasons with the Pittsburgh Steelers, including the first seven as a tight end before moving to tackle for the final seven years with the team.
- Drafted in the first round by the Steelers in the 1971 NFL Draft and would go on to make three Pro Bowls.
- One of only 22 players to win four Super Bowls during the 1970s dynasty.
- Caught a 4-yard touchdown pass from Terry Bradshaw late in the fourth quarter to seal the Steelers' victory in Super Bowl IX.
- Member of the Steelers' All-Time Team.

### Bill Cowher: Head Coach (1992-2006)

- During his 15 seasons as Head Coach, the team won 149 games, eight division titles and made 10 playoff appearances.
- The team won the division in each of his first six seasons as Head Coach.
- Led the Steelers to the Super Bowl twice, including a 21-10 victory over the Seattle Seahawks in Super Bowl XL.
- A Pittsburgh native, named the Associated Press NFL Coach of the Year in his first season (1992).

### Elbie Nickel: Tight End (1947-57)

- Drafted by the Steelers in 1947 and finished his career with 329 receptions.
- His 329 receptions rank second in team history for a tight end.
- Scored 37 career touchdowns, the eighth-most in Steelers history.
- Led the League in yards-per-catch in 1949 with a 24.3 average.
- Member of the Steelers' All-Time Team.

### Hines Ward: Wide Receiver (1998-2011)

- Drafted by the Steelers in the third round of the 1998 NFL Draft.
- Became the team's all-time leader in receptions, receiving yards and receiving touchdowns.
- Named MVP of Super Bowl XL after catching five passes for 123 yards and the game-clinching 43-yard touchdown catch.
- Arguably the best blocking wide receiver in NFL history.
- Two-time Super Bowl champion (Super Bowls XL and XLIII) and four-time Pro Bowl selection.
- Member of the Steelers' All-Time Team.

The 2019 Steelers Hall of Honor Induction ceremony was held on Sunday, Sept. 29, at Heinz Field, the weekend the Steelers hosted the Cincinnati Bengals on Monday Night Football (Sept. 30). Each inductee received a replica of a solid steel football, which replicated the original that was given to Steelers' founder Arthur J. Rooney Sr. by the United States Steel Corporation and United Steel Workers in 1982 on the occasion of the team's 50th Season.

The Steelers' Hall of Honor, established in 2017, is comprised of former players, coaches, and front office personnel who were integral in creating and sustaining the franchise's success dating back to when the team was founded in 1933.

The Hall of Honor Selection Committee consists of Steelers President Art Rooney II, Joe Gordon, Bob Labriola, Stan Savran, Andrew Stockey, and Tony Quatrini.

## TOMLIN GOING FOR TWO

- Pittsburgh failed to convert its first two-point play of the 2019 season -- **QB Mason Rudolph** was unable to convert on a pass play vs. Seattle on Sept. 15.
- Pittsburgh converted two of its four two-point attempts in 2017, and three of its nine tries in 2016, its first two conversions both coming in the first quarter of games (Oct. 2 vs. Kansas City and Oct. 16 at Miami).
- The Steelers converted 8-of-11 two-point attempts in 2015, which set an NFL record for the most conversions in a season.

## TOMLIN'S 100 WINS IN 10 SEASONS

- **Mike Tomlin** became the third head coach in Steelers history to record 100 regular-season wins in Week 14 of 2016, with the team's 27-20 victory at Buffalo.
- Tomlin joined **Chuck Noll** (1969-91, 193) and **Bill Cowher** (1992-2006, 149) in the team's 100-win club. The Steelers became the first NFL franchise with three 100-win head coaches.
- Tomlin earned his 100th regular-season victory in his 157th career regular-season game, which marked the fewest games by a Steelers head coach to reach the century mark (**Chuck Noll**, 158; **Bill Cowher**, 163).
- Tomlin's 100th win occurred in his 10th season with the Steelers, becoming the first Pittsburgh head coach to reach 100 wins in his first 10 years (**Bill Cowher**, 1992-2001, 99; **Chuck Noll**, 1976-78, 88).
- Tomlin also joined an elite NFL head coach fraternity by reaching 100 wins in his 10th season,
- Tomlin is the ninth head coach in NFL history to win 100 games in his first 10 seasons with one franchise, joining Bill Belichick (New England), Mike Ditka (Chicago), Joe Gibbs (Washington), John Madden (Oakland), Mike McCarthy (Green Bay), Marty Schottenheimer (Kansas City), Mike Shanahan (Denver) and Don Shula (Miami).

## AMONG COACHES IN FIRST 10 YEARS

### RUDOLPH IN RARIFIED AIR

- **QB Mason Rudolph** became the first quarterback in NFL history to register his first two career wins on Monday Night Football.
- Rudolph set single-game career highs in both pass attempts (36) and passing yards (251) in a 27-14 victory over Miami Dolphins on Oct. 28.
- Rudolph completed a 45-yard TD pass to **WR Diontae Johnson** that cut the Dolphins lead to 14-10 with 17 seconds remaining in the first half.
- The 45-yard TD pass came on 3rd down and 20, which gave the Steelers their first 3rd down conversion of 20 yards or longer since Nov. 11, 2016 against the Baltimore Ravens when **QB Ben Roethlisberger** hooked up with WR Eli Rogers for 30 yards on a 3rd down and 21 play.
- Rudolph completed a 26-yard TD pass to **WR JuJu Smith-Schuster** that gave the Steelers a 17-14 lead with 3:16 remaining in the third quarter.
- Rudolph has thrown at least two TD passes in four of his first five career NFL games.

- Rudolph's 85.7% (24 of 28) completion percentage (min. 20 completions) against Cincinnati (Sept. 30) was the highest for a quarterback in his second career start or earlier since the 1970 NFL-AFL merger.
- The previous record was 83.3% by Rob Johnson at Baltimore on Aug. 31, 1997.

### RUDOLPH SHINES IN HOME STARTING DEBUT

- In first NFL home start (and second start overall), **QB Mason Rudolph** completed 24 of 28 passes for 229 yards and two TDs against Cincinnati (Sept. 30).
- Rudolph set or equaled franchise records for a QB in his first career home start in completions (24), completion percentage (85.7), TD passes (tied, 2) and QB rating (124.6).
- Rudolph's 85.7 completion percentage against the Bengals was tied with **QB Ben Roethlisberger** (85.7 vs. Miami, Nov. 26, 2007) for the third-highest in franchise history (only Roethlisberger has exceeded Rudolph's effort from Monday night -- 88.0% vs. Carolina on Nov. 8, 2018 and 86.2% vs. Oakland on Dec. 9, 2018).
- Rudolph posted his third consecutive game with at least two TD passes (one of only two QBs in the NFL with a streak of at least three games -- Jacoby Brissett of the Indianapolis Colts has two TD passes in four straight games).
- Rudolph completed 17 of 18 passes for 133 yards and one TD in the opening half against Cincinnati.
- Rudolph completed each of his first seven passes against the Bengals -- five of which went to different receivers.
- Rudolph connected with **RB James Conner** on a 21-yard TD pass with 10:39 remaining in the second quarter, which gave the Steelers a 7-3 lead over Cincinnati.
- Rudolph hooked up with **WR Diontae Johnson** on a 43-yard TD pass with 9:32 remaining in the third quarter, which gave the Steelers a 24-3 lead over the Bengals.

### RUDOLPH/ROETHLISBERGER SIMILAR IN NFL DEBUTS

- In 2004 QB Tommy Maddox was injured in Week 2, and the injury happened on the fifth play of the third quarter. In his first NFL game, QB **Ben Roethlisberger** completed 12-of-20 (60 percent) for 171 yards, with two touchdowns, two interceptions, and a rating of 82.5.
- In 2019 QB **Mason Rudolph** started the second half against Seattle (Sept. 15), and he completed 12-of-19 (63.2 percent) for 112 yards, with two touchdowns, one interception, and a rating of 92.4.

## RUDOLPH IN STARTING DEBUT

- In first NFL start, **QB Mason Rudolph** completed 14 of 27 passes for 174 yards and two TDs at San Francisco (Sept. 22).
- Rudolph equaled the franchise record for TD passes in first career start (tied with Ron Smith, 1966; Rudy Bukich, 1960; Scott Campbell, 1985)
- Rudolph collected TD passes of 76 and 39-yards
- Rudolph is just the fifth quarterback in the NFL to throw for multiple TDs in his first career start (which came on the road) since 2016.

## HODGES MAKES HISTORY

- In first NFL start, and second career NFL appearance, **QB Devlin Hodges** completed 15 of 20 passes for 132 yards and one TD vs. Los Angeles Chargers (Oct. 13).
- Hodges' first career TD pass was a 26-yard connection with **RB James Conner** that extended the Steelers lead to 21-0 with 6:42 remaining in the first half.
- Hodges became the first Steelers quarterback to win his NFL starting debut since **Ben Roethlisberger** (W, 13-3 at Miami, Sept. 26, 2004).
- Hodges became the fifth Steelers quarterback to win his NFL starting debut since at least 1950.
- Hodges joined **Ben Roethlisberger** (2004), Steve Bono (1987), Mike Kruczek (1976) and Ted Marchibroda (1956) as Steelers quarterbacks to win NFL starting debut.
- Hodges made his NFL debut vs. Baltimore (Oct. 6) following an injury to **QB Mason Rudolph**.
- On his first career drive, Hodges completed 2 of 3 passes for 27 yards on the 10-play, 87-yard go-ahead TD march that gave Pittsburgh a 20-17 lead with 3:42 remaining in the third quarter.
- Hodges was the first Samford QB to appear in a professional football game since Jimmy Tarrant of the 1946 Miami Seahawks.
- Hodges was the first undrafted Steelers rookie with multiple completions in a single game since QB Tony Dungy on Oct. 9, 1977 at Houston.
- Hodges finished the game vs. Baltimore having completed 7 of 9 passes for 68 yards. He also added 20 yards rushing, including a game-high 21-yard scamper on the fourth-quarter go-ahead scoring drive.

## DEVLIN HODGES HASN'T DUCKED COMPETITION

- QB Devlin Hodges** was the all-time leader in career passing yards in FCS history with 14,584 career passing yards, which broke the old FCS national record of 14,496, set by Steve McNair (Alcorn State 1991-94). He received the 2018 Walter Payton Award as the top offensive player in all of FCS football.
- Hodges caught the attention of many following a record-setting performance and near upset of Florida State. He finished with 475 passing yards, including 317 in the first half, and became the first opposing player to rack up 400-plus yards of offense against the Seminoles since Clemson quarterback Deshaun Watson in 2016.
- Hodges set a school record for single-season passing yards, throwing for 4,283 yards during his senior season in 2018. He had six games that season in which he threw for at least 400 yards. Hodges won his third-straight Southern Conference Offensive Player of the Year honor in '18.
- Undrafted, Pittsburgh signed Hodges shortly after the 2019 draft. Hodges earned the final spot on the quarterback depth chart following the Steelers' rookie minicamp.
- Hodges didn't make Pittsburgh's initial 53-man roster but was added to the Steelers' practice squad after clearing waivers on Sept. 10.
- Hodges was then promoted to the 53-man roster on Sept. 16 following the season-ending injury to **QB Ben Roethlisberger**.

## HODGES, RUDOLPH HAVE SIMILAR DEBUTS

- QB Mason Rudolph** made his first career NFL start (at San Francisco on Sept. 22) in his second career NFL game.
- QB Devlin Hodges** made his first career NFL start (at Los Angeles Chargers on Oct. 13) in his second career NFL game.
- Pittsburgh became the 11th team since the 1970 NFL-AFL merger to have a pair of quarterbacks make their respective career starting debuts over the first six weeks of a season.
- Eight of the previous 11 occurrences came during the 1987 season, which featured the NFL strike and replacement players.
- Pittsburgh became the first NFL team to have a pair of quarterbacks make their respective starting debuts in the same season since Cleveland in 2014. The Browns started Johnny Manziel vs. Cincinnati in Week 15 and Connor Shaw at Baltimore in Week 17.
- Pittsburgh became the first NFL team to have a pair of quarterbacks make their respective starting debuts in the first six weeks of the same season since Dallas in 1989. The Cowboys started Steve Walsh in Week 5 at Green Bay and Troy Aikman in Week 1 at New Orleans.

## CONNER STRONG

- RB James Conner** rushed for a season-high 145 yards on 23 carries, including a 9-yard TD run in the 27-14 victory over Miami Dolphins (Oct. 28).
- Conner's 145 yards rushing is the second-highest single-game total of his career (he had 146 yards rushing exactly one year earlier -- Oct. 28, 2018 vs. Cleveland).
- Conner recorded a 9-yard TD run with 12:05 left in the fourth quarter that gave the Steelers a 24-14 lead over Miami.
- On the first play of the Steelers' second drive against the Dolphins, Conner registered a season-long run of 25 yards.
- Against Miami, Conner registered his first 100-yard rushing game of the season and sixth of his career.
- Conner recorded at least one touchdown in his fourth straight game and 11th time in the last 16 games.
- Conner registered his fourth rushing TD of the season and 16th of his career.
- Conner registered his fifth career game with at least 100 yards rushing and one touchdown.
- Conner registered a 12-yard TD at Los Angeles Chargers (Oct. 13) run that gave the Steelers a 14-0 lead with 4:35 remaining in the first quarter.
- Conner added a 26-yard TD catch that extended the Steelers lead to 21-0 with 6:42 left in the second quarter.
- The TD reception was Conner's second of the season and third of his career, and gave him his first career game with both a rushing TD and receiving TD.
- Conner set career-highs in both receptions (8) and receiving yards (83) in the rout of Cincinnati on Sept. 30. His previous career-highs in receptions (7 at Baltimore on Nov. 4, 2018) and receiving yards (75 vs. Atlanta on Oct. 7, 2018) both came last season.
- Conner hauled in a 21-yard TD reception from **QB Mason Rudolph** with 10:39 left in the second quarter, which gave the Steelers a 7-3 lead over the Bengals.

- Conner rushed for 55 yards on 14 carries, including a 1-yard TD run, vs. Baltimore on Oct. 6.
- Conner has 16 rushing touchdowns since the start of the 2018 season, which ranks tied for third in the NFL:

- Conner became the first player in team history with at least 1,000 scrimmage yards and 10 TDs in the team's first eight games of a season (2018), and scored at least one TD in five straight games (Games 5-9).
- Conner recorded three straight games with at least 100 rushing yards and two TDs in three consecutive games in 2018 (Games 5-7), becoming the first player in Steelers history - and the first NFL player since 2009 (Chris Johnson) - to tally three straight games with at least 100 rushing yards and two TDs.
- Conner rushed for nine TDs in the first eight games of 2018, tied for the most by a Steeler through the first eight games of a season (Franco Harris, 1976) and his 1,085 yards from scrimmage were the second-most through eight games of a season in team history (Le'Veon Bell, 1,086; 2014).

- Conner made the first start of his NFL career and set single-game career-highs for rushing yards (135), TDs (2 rushing) and scrimmage yards (192) on Kickoff Weekend of 2018 at Cleveland. He added 5 receptions for 57 yards.
- Conner's 135 rushing yards marked the first 100-yard rushing game of his NFL career and the fourth-most by a Steeler on Kickoff Weekend, while his 192 scrimmage yards were the third-most by a Steeler on Kickoff Weekend in team history.
- Conner totaled 65 yards from scrimmage (17 rushing / 48 receiving) and scored his third career rushing TD and of 2018, and his first as a Steeler at Heinz Field, on a 1-yard run, in Week 2 against Kansas City.
- In Week 5 vs. Atlanta at Heinz Field, Conner tallied 185 yards from scrimmage (110 rushing / 75 receiving), to go along with two rushing TDs. He became the second Steeler to record at least 100 rushing yards, 75 receiving yards and two rushing TDs in a game since 1950, joining Franco Harris (Nov. 25, 1979 vs. Cleveland).





### CONNER'S HONORS

- **RB James Conner** earned 2018 AFC Offensive Player of the Week (Week 8) and 2018 AFC Offensive Player of the Month (October) honors.
- In Week 8 of 2018, Conner led all players in multiple categories, including yards from scrimmage (212), rushing yards (146) and rushing TDs (2), adding 5 catches for 66 yards in Week 8's win vs. Cleveland at Heinz Field.
- Conner led the AFC in rushing TDs (6), yards from scrimmage per game (175.3), rushing yards per game (122.3) and rushes of 10+ yards (13) in the month of October, while rushing for at least 100 yards and two TDs in each of his three October games — becoming the first player in Steelers history with a three-game streak of at least 100-rushing yards and two rushing TDs and the first NFL player to do so since 2009.
- This marked the second time that Conner has taken home AFC honors in 2018 (Offensive Player of the Week: Week 8).

### SAMUELS' SWISS ARMY KNIFE

- **RB Jaylen Samuels** completed three passes, all out of the wildcat formation to **RB James Conner**, for 31 yards in the 27-3 rout of Cincinnati on Sept. 30.
- Samuels was the second player with 3 completions, 3 rushes and 3 catches in a game since the 1970 NFL-AFL merger, joining Terrelle Pryor in 2016.
- Samuels added 26 yards rushing, including a 2-yard TD run, and eight receptions for 57 yards (both career highs).
- Samuels was the first Pittsburgh running back with a completion, rush attempt and reception in the same game since Mewelde Moore in Week 4 of 2009 against the San Diego Chargers (Oct. 4).
- Samuels' 2-yard TD run, which was the first of his career, with 10:36 left in the third quarter gave the Steelers a 17-3 lead over the Bengals.
- Samuels was the first Steelers non-QB with multiple completions in a game since Antwaan Randle El in 2005.
- Samuels registered his first career pass attempt and pass completion on the Steelers' second drive of the game. The direct snap and ensuing pass play to Conner went for seven yards and a first down.

### HOLY TOLEDO, WR DIONTAE JOHNSON

- Rookie **WR Diontae Johnson** has recorded 25 catches for 296 yards and three TDs in 2019. He ranks among the rookie leaders in receptions (3rd), receiving yards (7th) and TD catches (t-4th).

- Johnson caught five passes for a career-best 84 yards and a touchdown against Miami Dolphins on Oct. 28. His previous career-high for receiving yards in a game was 77 vs. Cincinnati (Sept. 30).
- Johnson hauled in a 45-yard TD pass from **QB Mason Rudolph** that cut the Dolphins lead to 14-10 with 17 seconds remaining in the first half.

- In 2018 Fitzpatrick was one of just eight rookies with 50+ tackles and an interception, and one of just seven with 50+ tackles and 5+ passes defended.
- Fitzpatrick played three different positions – safety, boundary corner and slot corner – for the Dolphins defense.
- Fitzpatrick's 79 tackles in 2018 were 10th among rookies while his seven passes defended were tied for sixth.
- Fitzpatrick was selected by the Dolphins in the first round of the 2018 NFL Draft, the 11th pick overall.
- Fitzpatrick had 5 tackles in the Dolphins season opener against Baltimore and added 6 tackles against New England last week, with a forced fumble and fumble recovery.
- A three-year starter at Alabama, he played in 42 games, starting 38. He had 171 tackles, including 109 solo stops, 4.5 sacks, nine interceptions, 35 pass defenses and two forced fumbles. He won the Jim Thorpe Award as the nation's top defensive back his final season and became the third player in NCAA history to win both the Chuck Bednarik and Jim Thorpe Awards, joining Charles Woodson and Patrick Peterson with that honor. He was also a unanimous first-team All-American in 2017.







### FITZPATRICK TRICKS, MISTREATS HIS OLD TEAM

- **S Minkah Fitzpatrick** became the first player in the Super Bowl era to intercept two or more passes against a team he played for earlier that season.
- Fitzpatrick picked off Miami Dolphins QB Ryan Fitzpatrick twice on Oct. 28.
- Fitzpatrick registered two interceptions in a game for the first time in his career.
- Fitzpatrick became the first Steeler with multiple interceptions in a game since CB Brice McCain had two against Cincinnati on Dec. 28, 2014 (W, 27-17).
- Fitzpatrick has recorded three interceptions (all with the Steelers) in 2019 and five over his two-year career.
- Fitzpatrick has recorded three interceptions and forced a fumble over his first five games with the Steelers.
- Fitzpatrick became NFL player to pick off a quarterback with the same last name twice in a game since Detroit Lions' CB Levi Johnson intercepted Denver Broncos QB Charley Johnson twice in Week 12 of 1974.

### FITZPATRICK MAKES IMMEDIATE IMPACT

- **S Minkah Fitzpatrick** made quite a Steelers debut against San Francisco (Sept. 22).
- Fitzpatrick was the first Pittsburgh player to have an interception and forced fumble in the same game since William Gay vs. Indianapolis on Nov. 24, 2016.
- Fitzpatrick recorded his third career interception and first as a member of the Steelers.
- Fitzpatrick registered a forced fumble early in the second quarter.
- Fitzpatrick was the sixth Steelers defensive back to force a fumble and intercept a pass in the same game since 1993.

- **LB T.J. Watt** either leads or is tied for the team high in sacks (6.0), tackles for loss (6.0), quarterback hits (17) and forced fumbles (3).
- Watt's 17 quarterback hits ranks second in the NFL (only his brother J.J. of the Houston Texans has more quarterback hits with 20).
- Watt's 3 forced fumbles rank tied for sixth in the NFL.
- Watt's 6.0 sacks rank tied for 13th in the NFL.
- Watt's 6.0 tackles for loss rank tied for 20th in the NFL.
- Watt recorded 3 tackles, 3 quarterback hits, 2 sacks, 2 forced fumbles and 1 fumble recovery in the victory over Miami Dolphins on Oct. 28. It was his third career game with at least 2 forced fumbles and fifth career game with at least 2 sacks.

- Watt registered 1.5 sacks, three QB hits, one fumble recovery and one tackle for loss in the 27-3 rout of Cincinnati on Sept. 30.
- Watt's fumble recovery, his second of the season, stopped a second-quarter Bengals' drive inside the Pittsburgh 30-yard line.
- Watt recorded five tackles, 1.0 sack and 3.0 tackles for loss vs. Baltimore on Oct. 6. The 3.0 tackles for loss are his second most in a game (career best of 4.0 came on Sept. 9, 2018 at Cleveland).

## WATT'S 2018 CAMPAIGN

- With a 2.0 sack outing at Jacksonville in Week 11 of 2018, **LB T.J. Watt** became the first Steelers linebacker with at least 10.0 sacks in a season since 2010 (James Harrison and LaMarr Woodley).
- Along with 7.0 sacks in his 2017 rookie campaign, Watt is the first Steelers linebacker since 2013-14 (Jason Worlds) to record back-to-back seasons with at least 7.0 sacks.
- Watt finished Week 1 in Cleveland with 10 tackles (7 solo), 3.0 sacks (minus 16 yards) and a blocked field goal. He was named AFC Defensive Player of the Week for his Week 1 outing, becoming the first Steelers linebacker since 2010 (Lawrence Timmons, Week 6) to receive the honor.
- Watt posted his second career and second game of 2018 with 3.0 sacks in Week 5 vs. Atlanta, the third multi-sack game of his NFL career. He forced a fumble on his third sack of Atlanta QB Matt Ryan, in the fourth quarter, which was recovered by LB L.J. Fort in the Falcons' end zone for a touchdown.
- In the Steelers' regular-season finale vs. Cincinnati at Heinz Field, Watt totaled 7 tackles (4 solo) and two defensive forced fumbles on Cincinnati QB Jeff Driskel, including a strip-sack of Driskel (minus 6 yards) at the Bengals' 12-yard line in the third quarter. His defensive forced fumbles marked the fifth and sixth defensive forced fumbles of his 2018 season and increased his career total to seven to become the first Steeler with at least six defensive forced fumbles in a season since 2010 (James Harrison: 6).

## WATT WITH 20.0 SACKS IN FIRST TWO NFL SEASONS

- LB T.J. Watt** recorded 20.0 quarterback sacks over his first two seasons in the NFL. He became the ninth linebacker with at least 20.0 sacks in a player's first two campaigns since the statistic became official in 1982.

## WATT IN 2017 ROOKIE YEAR

- LB T.J. Watt** - the Steelers' first round selection the 2017 NFL Draft - recorded 52 tackles (39 solo), 7.0 sacks, 10 tackles for losses, 12 quarterback hits, eight passes defended, an interception, a forced fumble and blocked a field goal attempt in 15 games played, all starts, in his 2017 rookie season.
- Watt's 7.0 sacks topped the 2017 NFL rookie linebacker class - tied for second among all NFL rookies - and are the second-most by a rookie in Steelers history (Kendrell Bell, 2001: 9.0):

- Watt started his regular-season career in historical fashion. He became the first player to record at least 2.0 sacks and an interception in an NFL debut on Kickoff Weekend since sacks became an official statistic in 1982, finishing with 6 tackles, 2.0 sacks, two tackles for losses, one quarterback hit and one interception.
- With his 2.0 sack and one interception performance, Watt became the third player in NFL history to record 2.0 sacks and an interception in an NFL debut, joining Charles Glaze (Oct. 4, 1987) and Tommy Haynes (Oct. 4, 1987).
- Watt became the first Steeler with at least 2.0 sacks in their NFL debut since sacks became an official statistic in 1982 (previous mark, 1.5, Kenny Davidson, Sept. 9, 1990 at Cleveland).
- Watt became the first Steeler with at least 2.0 sacks and an interception in the same game since 2010 (LaMarr Woodley, Dec. 12 vs. Cincinnati).

## BUSHWHACKING THROUGH THE NFL

- **LB Devin Bush** has made quite an impact over his first seven games in the NFL.
- Bush recorded a nine-yard fumble return for TD vs. Los Angeles Chargers that gave the Steelers a 7-0 lead with 11:01 remaining in the first quarter.
- Bush added an interception, his second straight game with a pick, later in the first quarter that set up another Pittsburgh TD.
- Bush was the first NFL rookie with a fumble return for a TD and an interception in the same game since S Eddie Jackson of the Chicago Bears vs. Carolina on Oct. 22, 2017.
- Bush was the 11th NFL rookie with a fumble return for a TD and an interception in the same game since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger.
- Bush was the first Steelers rookie, and just the second since the 1970 NFL-AFL merger, with a fumble return for a TD and an interception in the same game (Delton Hall accomplished the feat vs. San Francisco on Sept. 13, 1987).
- Bush was the fifth overall Steelers player to accomplish the feat since the 1970 NFL-AFL merger.
- Bush was the first Steelers player with a fumble return for TD since LB L.J. Fort vs. Atlanta on Oct. 7, 2018.
- Bush was the first Steelers rookie with a fumble return for TD since Javon Hargrave at Cleveland on Nov. 20, 2016.
- Bush has been involved in six of the Steelers' 19 forced turnovers this season (four fumble recoveries and two interceptions).





- Bush is tied for the NFL lead in fumble recoveries with four.
- Bush leads the Steelers and all NFL rookies with 59 tackles.

- Bush finished the game against Cincinnati on Sept. 30 with 9 tackles, 3 for loss, 1.0 sack, one QB hit and one pass defended.
- Bush registered his first career sack in the opening quarter, which helped the Steelers force a punt on the Bengals opening drive of the game.
- Bush recorded 6 tackles, 2 for loss, 1.0 sack, one pass defended and another QB hit in the first half alone.
- Bush recovered a pair of fumbles in the first half (now has three fumble recoveries over the last two games) vs. San Francisco (Sept. 22).
- Bush became the first Steelers rookie with two fumble recoveries in the same game since at least 1950.

## HARGRAVE AT THE NOSE

- NT Javon Hargrave** finished 12th among all NFL defensive tackles with 6.5 sacks in 2018.
- Hargrave produced the first multi-sack game of his NFL career, bringing down Jacksonville QB Blake Bortles (minus five and eight yards) twice in the second quarter in Week 11.
- Hargrave extended his single-season career high to 6.5 sacks in 2018 with a sack in Week 13 vs. Los Angeles, (2016 and 2017: 2.0), and his career quarterback takedown total to 10.5.

## WILLIAMS ON THE 'D'

- LB Vince Williams** returned to the lineup vs. Baltimore on Oct. 6 after missing each of the previous two games with a hamstring injury.
- Williams recorded a team-high 9 tackles, 1.0 sack, 1.0 tackle for loss, 1 QB hit and 1 pass defended against the Ravens. He picked up his first sack of the season and 16th of his career.
- Williams led all players with 12 tackles (4 solo), including a tackle for a loss in Week 1 of 2018 at Cleveland. His 12 tackles marked the second double-digit tackle game of his NFL career (15, Oct. 2, 2016 vs. Kansas City).
- In Week 6 at Cincinnati, Williams led the Steelers with 7 total tackles (6 solo) and tallied his first sack of the season.
- In Week 10 vs. Carolina, Williams had 4 tackles (3 solo), including a sack of eight yards of Carolina QB Cam Newton. He picked off Newton in the first quarter, his second career interception, and returned it 17 yards for a TD to mark the first pick-six of his NFL career.
- Williams finished second on the Steelers' defense with 76 total tackles (50 solo) in 2018, and added 4.5 sacks and 8 tackles for losses, 10 quarterback hits, two passes defended and an interception returned for a touchdown.

## HADEN BREAKING IT UP

- CB Joe Haden** is tied for fourth on the Steelers in 2019 with 3 passes defended.

- Haden hauled in his third interception as a Steeler, picking off New England QB Tom Brady in the fourth quarter at the Steelers' 4-yard line in Week 15, his 22nd interception of his NFL career and his second in 2018. Haden led all defenders in the game with a game high 12 total tackles (8 solo), two passes defended to go along with his interception.
- Haden, a two-time Pro Bowl selection, made his Steelers debut, appearing in the 91st game of his NFL regular-season career and posted six tackles and 1.0 sack, on Kickoff Weekend of 2017 at the Cleveland Browns. He brought down Cleveland QB DeShone Kizer for a sack of three yards to end the first half – his first sack with the Steelers – third of his NFL career – and first since Sept. 11, 2011 (with Cleveland).
- In Week 7 vs. Cincinnati, Haden hauled in the 20th interception of his NFL career and his first as a Steeler, picking off Cincinnati QB Andy Dalton in the third quarter.
- The University of Florida product was a first-round (seventh overall) draft selection of the Browns in 2010. He has started 108-of-117 games played in the NFL and his career numbers include 459 tackles (374 solo), 22 interceptions, 120 passes defended, five forced fumbles, four fumble recoveries and 3.0 sacks.





## HILTON MAGIC

- **CB Mike Hilton** registered a forced fumble, which was his first of the season and the second of his career, in the 27-14 victory over Miami on Monday Night Football (Oct. 28).
- Hilton registered his fourth career interception and first of the season vs. Baltimore on Oct. 6. The interception gave the Steelers great field position late in the second quarter. Pittsburgh opened the ensuing drive at the Ravens' 25-yard line.
- Hilton led Pittsburgh's defense with 8 total tackles (6 solo), 2 tackles for losses and a quarterback hit, along with a sack and defensive fumble recovery in Week 14 of 2018 at Oakland. He recorded a sack of Oakland QB Derek Carr (minus 6 yards) in the second quarter, his first quarterback takedown of 2018 and the fifth of his NFL career, and recovered a fumble off of a team sack in the third quarter.
- He picked off Tampa Bay QB Ryan Fitzpatrick in the second quarter of a Week 3 Monday Night Football game at Tampa Bay at the Pittsburgh's 6-yard line — his first interception of 2018 — and the third of his NFL career. He also recovered a fumble in the second quarter, marking the first defensive fumble recovery of his NFL career.
- Hilton joined the Steelers' practice squad in December of 2016, and started four-of-16 games played with Pittsburgh in 2017, recording 54 tackles (42 solo), 4.0 sacks, two interceptions, eight quarterback hits and 10 tackles for losses and six passes defended.

## DEFENSIVE ADDITIONS'

- Pittsburgh signed two key additions to the defense this offseason, adding from **CB Steven Nelson** the Chiefs and **LB Mark Barron** from the Rams.
- In his five-year NFL career, four with Kansas City, Nelson has started 39-of-53 regular-season games. He also started four-of-six postseason games with the Chiefs. His career totals include 177 tackles (151 solo), four interceptions, 35 passes defended, 8 tackles for losses, two fumble recoveries and one forced fumble.
- In 104 regular-season games (93 starts) starts with Tampa Bay (2012-14) and the Los Angeles Rams (2014-18), Barron, the University of Alabama product has career totals including 630 tackles (485 solo), 9.0 sacks, eight interceptions, 39 passes defended, 17 quarterback hits, 44 tackles for losses, five forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries.

## WIZARD OF BOZ

- **K Chris Boswell** has made 13 of his 14 field goal attempts this season, including 6 of 7 from 40+ yards.
- Boswell, who entered Week 8 as one of three kickers in the NFL that had yet to miss a field goal with 11 or more attempts, failed to connect on a 54-yard field goal against Miami Dolphins on Monday Night Football (Oct. 28).
- Boswell's streak of consecutive field goals made ended at 14 following the miss.
- Since joining the Steelers in 2015, Boswell is 111-of-129 overall on field goal attempts (86.0%), including 40-of-51 (78.4%) between 40-49 yards.
- Boswell converted all three of his field goal attempts vs. Baltimore on Oct. 6, which marked his 19th career game with three or more field goals made.

**PITTSBURGH** — The Steelers came back from a 14-point deficit, putting 27 unanswered points on the board, to defeat the Miami Dolphins, 27-14.

The Steelers offense came to life late in the second half and never looked back as they improved their record to 3-4 in the season, keeping them right in the hunt in the AFC North.

**K Chris Boswell** extended the lead to 27-14 when he hit a 41-yard field goal. The Steelers got the ball after **LB T.J. Watt's** strip-sack of Ryan Fitzpatrick in the fourth quarter.

A successful replay challenge helped the Steelers achieve a two-score lead with 12:01 left in the fourth quarter.

The Dolphins were originally credited with a first down on a 1-yard run by quarterback Ryan Fitzpatrick on fourth-and-1 from the Steelers' 47-yard line. But head coach **Mike Tomlin's** challenge of the spot was upheld, Fitzpatrick was credited with a run for no gain and the Steelers took possession at the 47 with 18 seconds left in the third.

They took the ball and drove it 53 yards in five plays in 3:17 for a touchdown and a 24-14 lead. The capper was a 9-yard touchdown run by **RB James Conner**.

The Steelers went almost the entire length of the field to take their first lead of the night, 17-14, with 3:16 left in the third.

**QB Mason Rudolph** connected with **WR JuJu Smith-Schuster** on a 26-yard touchdown pass that capped a 12-play, 97-yard march in 7:47.

The Steelers had gained possession at their 3 following **S Minkah Fitzpatrick's** second interception against his former team.

The Dolphins struck first following a turnover.

Rudolph's first pass of the night, intended for Smith-Schuster, was intercepted by Dolphins cornerback Xavian Howard at the Steelers' 26-yard line. Ryan Fitzpatrick hit wide receiver Jakeem Grant for 17 yards to the Steelers' 8 and then finished the four-play march with a 5-yard touchdown pass to wide receiver Albert Wilson. Jason Sanders' extra point gave the Dolphins a 7-0 lead with 10:55 left in the first quarter.

The Steelers moved the ball on their next possession but ultimately turned it over on downs when Rudolph threw incomplete for **WR James Washington** on fourth-and-6 from the Miami 37.

This time, the Dolphins drove 63 yards in 11 plays for a touchdown and a 14-0 lead with 1:34 left in the first.

The big play was a connection from Fitzpatrick to wide receiver DeVante Parker for 15 yards on third-and-14 from the Miami 43.

The scoring pass was a 12-yard catch-and-run completion to wide receiver Allen Hurns, who evaded attempted tackles by **LB Devin Bush**, **LB Mark Barron**, **CB Steven Nelson** and **S Terrell Edmunds** on the way to the end zone.

The Steelers got on the board with 2:45 left in the first half on a 42-yard field goal by Boswell.

The scoring drive covered 70 yards over 12 plays, including a Rudolph pass to **WR Diontae Johnson** that went for 12 yards on third-and-11 from the Steelers' 5, and a 34-yard gain to Smith-Schuster on third-and-5 from the Steelers' 45.

A Dolphins' turnover gave the Steelers a chance to get closer prior to halftime, and the Steelers took full advantage.

Fitzpatrick's pass for tight end Nick O'Leary on second-and-6 from the Miami 44 with 1:22 left in the second quarter bounced off O'Leary and was intercepted by Minkah Fitzpatrick. His 6-yard return set the Steelers up at the 50 with 1:13 left before the break.

Rudolph found Johnson for a 45-yard score on third-and-20 from the Miami 45 that brought the Steelers to within 14-10 with 17 seconds remaining in the half. Johnson caught the ball 2 yards past the line of scrimmage and covered the last 43 yards on the ground.

**INDIANAPOLIS** — Ben Roethlisberger's 32-yard completion to Antonio Brown with 35 seconds set up a 33-yard field goal from **Chris Boswell** as time expired Sunday, giving Pittsburgh a 20-17 come-from-behind win at Indianapolis.

The Steelers (7-2) have won four straight overall and five in a row in the series.

But it sure wasn't easy as the Colts (3-7) held Roethlisberger, Antonio Brown and Le'Veon Bell in check. Pittsburgh needed two second-half TD passes from Roethlisberger to fight its way out of a 17-3 third-quarter deficit. And Roethlisberger reverted to his traditional form on the Steelers' final possession.

The two-time Super Bowl champion methodically marched the Steelers 70 yards in the final 3 minutes, 10 seconds to give Pittsburgh its only lead.

Roethlisberger was 19 of 31 for 236 yards with one interception. Bell had 26 carries for 80 yards and Brown, the league's leading receiver, caught three passes for 47 yards.

Indianapolis extended its 10-3 halftime lead to 17-3 when Jacoby Brissett hooked up with Chester Rogers on a 61-yard TD pass four plays into the second half. But again the Colts couldn't hold onto the lead.

Roethlisberger found **JuJu Smith-Schuster** on a 7-yard TD pass midway through the third quarter to make it 17-9. Boswell's extra point was blocked and the Steelers barely avoided giving up two more points when Colts safety was tackled at the Steelers 2-yard line after a lengthy return.

After **Ryan Shazier's** interception at the Colts 10-yard line with 12:52 to go, Roethlisberger hooked up with wide-open **Vance McDonald** for another 7-yard score. Roethlisberger's conversion pass to Martavis Bryant tied the score at 17.

Boswell could have given the Steelers the lead with a 37-yard field goal with 6:17 to go, but the kick hit the right goal post.

## New England 33 Pittsburgh 3

SEPTEMBER 8, 2019 /// GILLETTE STADIUM (65,878)



**FOXBOROUGH, Mass.** — It wasn't the opening night the Steelers had hoped for as they fell to the New England Patriots, 33-3, on a night where nothing seemed to go right.

The offense couldn't get in the end zone, while the defense wasn't able to stop Tom Brady and company. The Patriots drew first blood on their second possession.

Quarterback Tom Brady went 3-for-4 passing for 69 yards on the seven-play, 82-yard march in 3:08, including a 20-yard catch-and-run touchdown to wide receiver Josh Gordon. The Patriots overcame a first-and-20 from the New England 25-yard line following an offensive pass interference penalty. Consecutive carries by running back James White following the penalty set up a third-and-5, which Brady converted by hitting wide receiver Phillip Dorsett for 8.

The big play was a backwards pass from Brady to wide receiver Julian Edelman, who then threw back across the field to White, who got down the far sideline for a 32-yard gain to the Steelers' 20.

Gordon scored on the next snap.

New England increased its advantage to 10-0 on a 25-yard field goal by kicker Stephen Gostkowski with 11:52 left in the second quarter.

New England's 12-play, 55-yard drive in 5:24 achieved a first-and-goal at the Steelers' 9, but the defense allowed only 2 yards on the next three snaps.

Brady drove the Pats again late in the second quarter and culminated a six-play, 80-yard drive in 3:09 with a 25-yard touchdown pass to Dorsett. Brady's second touchdown pass of the night directly followed 16- and 24-yard connections to Edelman.

Gostkowski added a 41-yard field goal 17 seconds prior to halftime that upped the New England lead to 20-0.

The Steelers twice failed to convert third-and-1s in the second quarter (one on an inside rush by running back **James Conner** and one on a pitch to Conner).

They were also denied on fourth-and-1 from the Patriots' 47 just inside the first half's two-minute warning (wide receiver **Donte Moncrief** couldn't hang on to a short pass from quarterback **Ben Roethlisberger** with safety Patrick Chung defending).

The Patriots had 15 first downs to the Steelers' four and out-gained the Steelers, 275-87, in the first two quarters.

The Steelers drove 74 yards on 11 plays in 4:43 on the opening possession of the second half but wound up settling for a 19-yard field goal by kicker **Chris Boswell** on fourth-and-goal from the Patriots' 1.

The big play on the drive was a 45-yard connection from Roethlisberger to wide receiver **James Washington** on third-and-10 from the Steelers' 37. It was the Steelers' second third-down conversion in seven attempts (the Pats converted five of their first nine third-down tries).

New England responded with a 58-yard touchdown pass from Brady to Dorsett with 8:05 left in the third quarter.

Gostkowski's third field goal, a 35-yard effort, made it 30-3 with 13 seconds left in the third quarter. A Brady-to-Gordon 44-yard hookup pushed the ball from the Patriots' 14 to the Steelers' 42. New England finished the drive with points for the second time in two third-quarter possessions.

The Patriots didn't stop there. Even on a drive where they were penalized twice for offensive holding, they still were able to put points on the board. Gostkowski hit a 39-yard field goal, extending the lead to 33-3.

A late drive by the Steelers was thwarted when Roethlisberger's pass for Washington in the end zone was intercepted by Devin McCourty

**PITTSBURGH** — The Steelers fought back late, but weren't able to stop the Seahawks on their final drive, falling, 28-26, in the team's home opener at Heinz Field. The loss dropped the Steelers to 0-2.

The Steelers got back in the game late when **Devin Bush** picked up the loose ball at the 14-yard line on an aborted play, and returned it to the three-yard line, where he went out of bounced. **Mason Rudolph** hit **Vance McDonald** for a three-yard touchdown, cutting the lead to 28-26 after **Chris Boswell's** extra point.

The Seahawks achieved some much-needed separation in a back-and-fourth affair on a 28-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Russell Wilson to wide receiver DK Metcalf with 7:15 left in the fourth quarter.

A successful challenge of a non-call for defensive pass interference on strong safety **Terrell Edmunds** turned an incompletion and an impending third-and-20 into a first-and-10 at the Steelers' 35-yard line. Wilson found Metcalf three snaps later.

Kicker Jason Myers' extra point gave Seattle a 28-19 lead.

The Seahawks took the ball away early in the third quarter and then took the lead.

Wilson connected with tight end Will Dissly on first-and-10 from the Steelers' 12-yard line for a touchdown with 9:49 left in the third quarter. Dissly got behind inside linebacker Bush and caught the ball in front of free safety **Sean Davis**. Myers' extra point made it 14-10 Seahawks.

The scoring drive began at the Steelers' 40 after a pass from quarterback Rudolph bounced off wide receiver **Donte Moncrief** and was intercepted by Seahawks free safety Bradley McDougald.

Rudolph had replaced starting quarterback **Ben Roethlisberger** (right elbow) on the Steelers' first possession of the second half.

The Steelers countered the Seahawks' third-quarter touchdown with a 33-yard field goal by kicker Boswell that cut the Seattle advantage to 14-13. The big play on their seven-play, 60-yard drive in 3:28 was a 45-yard flea flicker, a pitch from running back **James Conner** back to Rudolph, who then found wide receiver **JuJu Smith Schuster** for a gain to the Seattle 16-yard line.

Seattle countered with a 37-yard burst for a touchdown by running back Rashaad Penny on third-and-2 with 3:04 left in the third quarter.

The Steelers' next possession ended on an 8-yard touchdown pass from Rudolph to McDonald that capped a 12-play, 75-yard march in 6:40. Rudolph's pass to Smith-Schuster for a two-point conversion was intercepted and the Seahawks retained the lead at 21-19 with 11:16 left in regulation.

A 41-yard field goal by Boswell had snapped a 7-7 tie with 2:28 remaining in the second quarter.

The Steelers had taken over following a punt at their 28 with 5:54 left prior to halftime. The Seahawks were guilty of defensive holding on the first snap of the drive. Roethlisberger then connected on three straight passes, one to Smith-Schuster, one to wide receiver **James Washington** and another to Smith-Schuster, for a combined 39 yards to the Seahawks' 28. The drive stalled thanks in part to an offensive pass interference penalty against McDonald on third-and-4 from the Seahawks' 22.

Seattle had tied the game at 7-7 on a 14-yard touchdown pass from Wilson to tight end Dissly, who caught the ball in the end zone behind Bush and in front of Davis. The Seahawks had kicked a field goal on fourth-and-3 from the Steelers' 28, but Steelers defensive tackle **Dan McCullers** was called for unnecessary roughness and that set Seattle up with a first down at the Steelers' 14.

A penalty had also negated the Steelers' first touchdown.

Inside linebacker **Mark Barron** recovered a fumble created by outside linebacker **T.J. Watt** late in the first quarter and returned the ball 34 yards for a score, but Davis was called for an illegal block behind Barron as Barron was running into the end zone.

The Steelers took over at the Seahawks' 22 and attained a first-and-goal at the Seattle 1 after outside linebacker Mychal Kendricks was called for pass interference on a fade to running back **Jaylen Samuels** at the end zone pylon. Conner followed with a 1-yard touchdown run.

The Steelers sacked Wilson four times in the first half.

**SANTA CLARA, Calif.** — The Steelers fall to 0-3 after losing the San Francisco 49ers, 24-20, at Levi's Stadium.

The defense came up with five takeaways, but it wasn't enough. A late fumble by **James Conner** lead to the 49ers game-winning touchdown.

The 49ers were driving to re-gain the lead, when the defense came up with their fifth takeaway of the game. On an aborted play, the receiver was in motion and the ball was snapped early, hit Richie James Jr. and **T.J. Watt** came up with the recovery at the Steelers 14-yard line. But the 49ers got the ball right back when Conner's fumble was recovered by DeForest Buckner at the Steelers 24-yard line. The 49ers would make it count. Jimmy Garoppolo hit Dante Pettis for a five-yard touchdown to give them a 24-20 lead, which would seal the win.

Quarterback **Mason Rudolph's** second touchdown pass of the game, a 39-yard deep ball to wide receiver **Diontae Johnson**, put the Steelers back in front. Kicker **Chris Boswell's** extra point made it 20-17, with 10:22 left in the fourth quarter.

Running back Jeff Wilson Jr.'s second touchdown of the game, this one a 4-yard blast on first-and-goal, helped put the 49ers back on top at 17-13 with 4:46 left in the third quarter. San Francisco responded to falling behind 13-10 with a 10-play, 75-yard march in 4:46.

A big play had allowed the Steelers to regain the lead with 5:42 left in the third quarter.

Rudolph hit wide receiver **Juju Smith-Schuster** on a crossing route on third-and-4 from the Steelers' 26-yard line and Smith-Schuster got to the boundary, turned up the field and didn't stop until he'd crossed the goal line. The 76-yard, catch-and-run touchdown included about 65 yards gained after the catch, Smith Schuster eluding cornerback Ahkello Witherspoon and free safety Tarvarius Moore, and a downfield block by tight end **Xavier Grimble** on inside linebacker Kwon Alexander.

Boswell's extra point put the Steelers ahead, 13-10.

The Steelers had taken a 6-3 lead into the third quarter but it didn't last long.

Rudolph was intercepted on second-and-5 from the Steelers' 32 on the first possession of the second half after having been flushed from the pocket and pressured by defensive end Arik Armstead. Cornerback K'Waun Williams' pick put the 49ers in business at the Steelers' 38-yard-line.

Wilson Jr.'s 1-yard plunge on third-and-goal from the 1 capped an eight-play drive in 4:02 that gave the 49ers a 10-6 lead.

Boswell opened the scoring with a 46-yard field goal with 11:47 left in the first quarter.

The scoring drive featured three completions on Rudolph's first three attempts but only covered 5 yards following Watt's interception of a bobbled screen pass and 7-yard return to the San Francisco 33-yard line.

Boswell connected for the third time in as many games and for the fourth time in four tries overall this season.

San Francisco's third possession produced the same result as its first, the 49ers turned the ball over and the Steelers converted an interception into a field goal.

This time it was free safety **Minkah Fitzpatrick** collecting the carom of a pass from quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo that deflected off wide receiver Dante Pettis. Fitzpatrick's 14-yard return set the Steelers up at the 49ers' 24, but the Steelers ultimately settled for a 26-yard field goal by Boswell.

By then the trend had apparently been set.

The 49ers turned the ball over again on each of their next two possessions, both times in Steelers' territory.

Inside linebacker **Devin Bush** recovered a fumble at the Steelers' 9 with 14:51 left in the second quarter. Running back Raheem Mostert was initially separated from the football by Fitzpatrick.

Bush jumped on a subsequent loose ball at the Steelers' 7 with 11:25 remaining prior to halftime after a fumble by Garoppolo on a snap.

The 49ers forced a three-and-out following their fourth turnover and took over at the Steelers' 49 following a punt.

This time San Francisco put together a nine-play, 43-yard drive in 3:52 that concluded with a 24-yard field goal by kicker Robbie Gould 6:45 before the break.

Fitzpatrick made his Steelers debut and Rudolph made his first NFL start.

The Steelers lost tight end **Vance McDonald** (shoulder) in the second quarter.

The interceptions by Watt and Fitzpatrick were the Steelers' first two of the season.

**PITTSBURGH** — The Steelers got a much-needed win on Monday night, defeating the Cincinnati Bengals, 27-3.

The Steelers were in control from the beginning, with a swarming defense that got to Andy Dalton all night and an offense that moved the ball.

The Wildcat formation the Steelers unveiled for the occasion paid dividends throughout, including on the first possession of the third quarter.

A direct snap to running back **Jaylen Samuels** turned into a pitch-pass to running back **James Conner**, who was coming across the back of the formation in motion. Conner bolted for 21 yards to the Cincinnati 2-yard line. From there, Samuels took another direct snap and waltzed into the end zone. Boswell's extra point upped the Steelers' lead to 17-3 with 10:26 left in the third.

A 43-yard touchdown pass from quarterback **Mason Rudolph** to wide receiver **Diontae Johnson** made in 24-3 Steelers the next time they got their hands on the ball. Following an incompletion on first-and-10 from the Bengals' 43, Rudolph found Johnson uncovered deep in the Cincinnati secondary for his second touchdown pass of the night and the Steelers' fourth score in four possessions.

**Chris Boswell** closed out the scoring at 27-3 in the fourth quarter when he hit a 49-yard field goal.

Through three quarters the Bengals had been held to 11 first downs and 130 total net yards on 44 offensive plays. Quarterback Andy Dalton was sacked six times in the first three quarters (defensive tackle **Cam Heyward** and outside linebacker **T.J. Watt** each had 1.5 sacks).

Inside linebacker **Mark Barron** intercepted a pass in the end zone on fourth-and-goal from the Steelers' 13 with 11:02 left in the fourth. It was the Steelers' second takeaway of the night (Watt recovered a Dalton fumble following a strip-sack by outside linebacker **Bud Dupree** on second-and-10 from the Steelers' 18 in the second quarter).

Boswell capped an 11-play, 60-yard drive that reached the Cincinnati 7-yard line just before halftime with a 29-yard field goal that gave the Steelers a 10-3 lead 58 seconds before the break.

The drive stalled when Samuels was stopped for a loss of 4 on third-and-3 from the Bengals' 7.

Boswell improved to 6-for-6 on field goals for the season and has hit at least one in all four games.

The Steelers went to the locker room at halftime having converted just one of four third-down attempts but still had a 16:36-13:24 edge in time of possession.

Good field position following a three-and-out from the defense positioned the Steelers for a five-play, 46-yard drive for a touchdown and a 7-3 lead with 10:32 left in the second.

After taking over at the Cincinnati 46 following a punt from the Bengals' 5, Rudolph completed four passes on four attempts for 43 yards on the march, including a 21-yard catch-and-run touchdown to Conner.

The Bengals turned an early turnover into the first points of the night.

Johnson hauled in a short pass from Rudolph on the Steelers' second offensive snap but lost the ball after a hit by linebacker Nick Vigil. Bengals safety Jessie Bates III recovered at the Steelers' 15.

Dalton threw into the end zone without success on first down and again on third down and the Bengals settled for kicker Randy Bullock's 28-yard field goal and a 3-0 lead with 8:22 left in the first.

The loss dropped the Steelers to 1-4 on the season

The team also lost **QB Mason Rudolph**, who suffered a concussion in the game. Rudolph left Heinz Field during the game to be further evaluated at the hospital.The Steelers won the toss in overtime and deferred, putting their defense on the field. The defense held, giving the offense the ball with **QB Devlin Hodges** at the helm. Hodges completed a pass to **WR JuJu Smith-Schuster**, who fumbled. The ball was recovered by Marlon Humphrey.

Seattle would run three plays and gain six yards to set up a 46-yard field goal attempt for K Justin Tucker. The Ravens placekicker snuck the ball just inside the left upright and Baltimore secured a 26-23 victory.

**K Chris Boswell** appeared to put the Steelers back in the driver's seat when he hit a 33-yard field goal with 2:37 to play, going up, 23-20. The key play on the drive was when Hodges scrambled and broke free for a 21-yard gain, with a holding call tacked on to the end of it.

However, the Ravens drove down the field at the end of regulation and Tucker tied it with 10 seconds to play, 23-23, to send the game into overtime.

With the game tied at 20-20, a swarming defense completely shut down the Ravens. Buried at their own one-yard line following a punt, they went no further. The Ravens had to punt, and the Steelers took over at Baltimore's 45-yard line.

The Steelers took their first lead of the game despite losing Rudolph in the third quarter.

Rudolph suffered a concussion on third-and-11 from the Steelers' 12-yard line while extending the play and eventually finding **WR James Washington** for a 26-yard gain while absorbing a helmet-to-helmet hit from Ravens safety Earl Thomas III.

A 15-yard roughing-the-passer penalty was tacked on, which gave the Steelers a first-and-10 at the Baltimore 48.

Enter Hodges.

The Steelers' third quarterback of the season hit **WR Diontae Johnson** for 13 yards and **TE Vance McDonald**, this time on a play-action bootleg, for 14 yards to the Baltimore 1. **RB James Conner**, with **LB Tyler Matakevich** at fullback, finished off the 10-play, 87-yard drive in 4:40 with a 1-yard touchdown run. Boswell's extra point made it 20-17 Steelers, with 3:42 left in the third quarter.

The Ravens reached the Steelers' 9 on their next possession but ultimately settled for a 26-yard field goal from Tucker that tied the game at 20-20.

The Steelers scored the final six points of the first half and went to the locker room after two quarters trailing, 17-13.

An interception of a deflected pass and 10-yard return by **S Kameron Kelly** gave the Steelers possession at the Ravens' 16. Kelly was being used periodically a six-defensive backs package on third downs.The Steelers reached the Ravens 7 on the subsequent possession but lost 5 yards on a second-and-1 Wildcat sweep by **RB Jaylen Samuels** and then 11 more when Rudolph was sacked on third-and-6. Boswell salvaged a 41-yard field goal on a scoring drive that lost 7 yards but cut the Ravens' lead to 17-10.Another interception, this one by **CB Mike Hilton**, set the Steelers up at the Ravens' 25 with 33 seconds left prior to halftime. A roughing-the-passer penalty pushed the ball to the 11, where Rudolph threw incomplete into the end zone for Washington.

Boswell's 29-yard field goal on the last play of the first half drew the Steelers to within four at the break.

The Ravens scored on three consecutive possessions after holding the Steelers without a first down on the game's opening possession.

Baltimore went 50 yards in 10 plays after taking over at its 41-yard line following a punt and 2-yard return and concluded the march with a 27-yard field goal by Tucker for a 3-0 lead.

The Steelers' next snap ended on an interception thrown by Samuels on a Wildcat pass for Washington. LB Josh Byrnes' pick set the Ravens up at the Steelers' 15. RB Mark Ingram finished a four-play series with a 4-yard touchdown run for a 10-0 Baltimore lead with 4:48 left in the first quarter.

The Ravens went on 13-play, 65-yard drive in 6:20 that culminated with an 11-yard touchdown pass from QB Lamar Jackson to WR Marquise Brown for a 17-7 Ravens' advantage.

The Jackson-to-Brown scoring strike countered a 35-yard touchdown pass from Rudolph to Smith-Schuster that cut the Steelers' deficit to 10-7. Smith-Schuster hauled in Rudolph's pass at the Baltimore 20 and ran through CB Marlon Humphrey's attempt to hammer the ball from Smith-Schuster's grasp at the Ravens' 10.

**CARSON, Calif.** — The Steelers went into Sunday night's game against the Chargers with an undrafted rookie quarterback in Devlin Hodges and came out with a much needed 24-17 win. The win improves the Steelers to 2-4 as they head into their bye.

The Chargers made it interesting as Philip Rivers hit Hunter Henry for his second touchdown of the game, closing the gap to 24-17 with 1:29 to play. The Chargers got the ball back one last time, but Cam Sutton picked off Rivers to secure the win.

The Chargers scored when Hunter Henry was able to get both feet down in the back of the end zone on a five-yard scoring strike from Philip Rivers. The 10-play, 70-yard drive took 3:23, cutting the lead to 24-10.

The Steelers' bid for a shutout was stymied when Chargers kicker Chase McLaughlin connected on a 38-yard field goal with 14 minutes left in the fourth quarter.

That cut the visitor's lead to 24-3.

Up 21-0 at the break, the Steelers added on after receiving the kickoff to start the third quarter.

Kicker Chris Boswell's 20-yard field goal with 8:12 left in the third capped a 13-play, 73-yard drive in 6:48 and gave the Steelers a 24-0 lead. The Steelers had achieved a first-and-goal at the Chargers' 2-yard line but settled for three points after two runs for no gain and a throw-away heave by quarterback Devlin Hodges following an errant shotgun snap on third down.

The Steelers started fast and had the defense to thank for it.

The defense opened the scoring when inside linebacker Devin Bush collected a fumble and returned it 9 yards for a touchdown with 10:51 left in the first quarter. The fumble occurred when quarterback Philip Rivers tried a backwards pass to running back Melvin Gordon in the flat on second-and-10 from the Chargers 21 but sailed the ball over Gordon's head. Boswell's extra point made it 7-0, Steelers.

Bush was at it again on the Chargers' next possession. He corralled the carom of a Rivers pass intended for wide receiver Keenan Allen that was deflected by defensive lineman Tyson Alualu. Bush's 6-yard return set the Steelers up at the Chargers' 40.

Running back James Conner took over from there.

Conner touched the ball on seven consecutive snaps (four rushes, three receptions) and finished off what ended up as a seven-play, 40-yard drive with a 12-yard touchdown run. Conner converted third downs on the march with a 12-yard reception on third-and-4 from the Chargers' 34 and on a 4-yard grab on third-and-4 from the Chargers' 16. Boswell's PAT made it 14-0 with 4:29 left in the opening quarter.

The Steelers upped their lead again the next time they got their hands on the football.

This time it was Conner hauling in a pass in the flat from Hodges, running through linebacker Jatavis Brown near the sideline and scampering 26 yards for his second TD of the night and Hodges' first touchdown pass of his NFL career. The Steelers converted three third downs on the 14-play, 86-yard possession in 9:09 — as many third downs as they'd converted in each of their first five games — including one on the scoring strike. Boswell made it 21-0 with 6:34 left in the second quarter.

McLaughlin missed a 43-yard field goal attempt with 32 seconds left in the first half (the ball hit the left upright).

Defensive end Stephon Tuitt (pectoral) left the game early in the first and did not return.

Bush went down and stayed down momentarily with 4:03 left in the second (ankle) but eventually got up and walked off the field. Bush didn't play in the remainder of the first half but returned for the first defensive possession of the second.

**PITTSBURGH** — The Steelers came back from a 14-point deficit, putting 27 unanswered points on the board, to defeat the Miami Dolphins, 27-14.

The Steelers offense came to life late in the first half and never looked back as they improved their record to 3-4 in the season, keeping them right in the hunt in the AFC North.

**K Chris Boswell** extended the lead to 27-14 when he hit a 41-yard field goal. The Steelers got the ball after LB **T.J. Watt's** strip-sack of Ryan Fitzpatrick in the fourth quarter.

A successful replay challenge helped the Steelers achieve a two-score lead with 12:01 left in the fourth quarter.

The Dolphins were originally credited with a first down on a 1-yard run by quarterback Ryan Fitzpatrick on fourth-and-1 from the Steelers' 47-yard line. But head coach **Mike Tomlin's** challenge of the spot was upheld, Fitzpatrick was credited with a run for no gain and the Steelers took possession at the 47 with 18 seconds left in the third.

They took the ball and drove it 53 yards in five plays in 3:17 for a touchdown and a 24-14 lead. The capper was a 9-yard touchdown run by **RB James Conner**.

The Steelers went almost the entire length of the field to take their first lead of the night, 17-14, with 3:16 left in the third.

**QB Mason Rudolph** connected with **WR JuJu Smith-Schuster** on a 26-yard touchdown pass that capped a 12-play, 97-yard march in 7:47.

The Steelers had gained possession at their 3 following S **Minkah Fitzpatrick's** second interception against his former team.

The Dolphins struck first following a turnover.

Rudolph's first pass of the night, intended for Smith-Schuster, was intercepted by Dolphins cornerback Xavian Howard at the Steelers' 26-yard line. Ryan Fitzpatrick hit wide receiver Jakeem Grant for 17 yards to the Steelers' 8 and then finished the four-play march with a 5-yard touchdown pass to wide receiver Albert Wilson. Jason Sanders' extra point gave the Dolphins a 7-0 lead with 10:55 left in the first quarter.

The Steelers moved the ball on their next possession but ultimately turned it over on downs when Rudolph threw incomplete for **WR James Washington** on fourth-and-6 from the Miami 37.

This time, the Dolphins drove 63 yards in 11 plays for a touchdown and a 14-0 lead with 1:34 left in the first.

The big play was a connection from Fitzpatrick to wide receiver DeVante Parker for 15 yards on third-and-14 from the Miami 43.

The scoring pass was a 12-yard catch-and-run completion to wide receiver Allen Hurns.

The Steelers got on the board with 2:45 left in the first half on a 42-yard field goal by Boswell.

The scoring drive covered 70 yards over 12 plays, including a Rudolph pass to **WR Diontae Johnson** that went for 12 yards on third-and-11 from the Steelers' 5, and a 34-yard gain to Smith-Schuster on third-and-5 from the Steelers' 45.

A Dolphins' turnover gave the Steelers a chance to get closer prior to halftime, and the Steelers took full advantage.

Fitzpatrick's pass for tight end Nick O'Leary on second-and-6 from the Miami 44 with 1:22 left in the second quarter bounced off O'Leary and was intercepted by Minkah Fitzpatrick. His 6-yard return set the Steelers up at the 50 with 1:13 left before the break.

Rudolph found Johnson for a 45-yard score on third-and-20 from the Miami 45 that brought the Steelers to within 14-10 with 17 seconds remaining in the half. Johnson caught the ball 2 yards past the line of scrimmage and covered the last 43 yards on the ground.
